Reading Children should continue to read widely over the holiday. Here is a link to the Year 5 and Year 6 reading lists, which can be found on our website, in The Library section. Writing opportunities Any opportunities where there is a purpose for writing: diaries, post-cards, letters, describing a scene. We encourage the children to go for quality over quantity, with regular reviewing and improving.	Century Children can access their tailored learning pathway on topics from this year. Equipment for September: For Maths, all children require pencils, 30cm ruler, protractor and compass. In Year 7, children are required to have their own scientific calculator. We recommend Casio FX-85GTX, available from Amazon. For English, all children require a blue ink pen that they are confident writing with. The expectation is that all children will always have a reading book at school.
